Responsibilities	*Collaborate with PTHV District Coordinator to coordinate trainings and on-boarding for all interested staff members
	*Manage the monthly data collection and distribution for all home visit activities by maintaining appropriate records of visits completed
	*Communicate protocols, expectations, and best practices regarding home visits to all trained staff members based upon district coordinator's monthly updates and data-sharing
	*Work with school's payroll secretary to ensure the proper compensation for all staff trained and completing visits and trouble shoot issues as needed
	*Motivate staff to participate in home visit program through collaboration with school administration and coordinate involvement in district-wide home visit events

Compensation	Yearly Stipend - \$500-800 (add'l opportunities for performance-based incentives)
