Bus Safety and Code of Conduct


Other reference Policy EEAEC

Policy JK and JK-R (Student Discipline) shall control student discipline related to misconduct by students on school buses, district vehicles, or any transportation provider utilized by the district.

NOTE: These rules apply to bus routes, field trips and athletic trips.

Safety and Etiquette Tips

- Arrive at the bus stop 10 minutes before your scheduled pickup time in the morning.
- Walk safely to the bus stop and wait safely away from traffic.
 Line up so you're ready to get on the bus and wait until it has come to a complete stop before approaching.



- When crossing the street, always cross 10 feet in front of the bus. Look left, right, and left again to check for traffic before crossing.
- Watch your step and use the handrail when getting on and off the bus.



If a student regularly violates these rules, the bus driver or paraprofessional will notify their supervisor, who will work with the family to address the behavior.

Student Code of Conduct

- 1. Obey the bus driver and bus assistant at all times, and also be respectful of other passengers.
- 2. Find your assigned seat quickly and sit quietly. Remain seated, keeping the aisle clear, while the bus is moving. Wait until the bus has come to a complete stop before leaving your seat.
- 3. Do not throw anything off the bus. Do not stick your head or arms outside of windows.
- 4. Talk in normal tones; loud rude, vulgar or obscene language is prohibited.
- 5. Keep the bus clean and free of damage.
- 6. All student items such as musical instruments, athletic equipment and backpacks must be in their possession at all times, and must be carried in their lap or properly secured under a seat.
- 7. Skateboards, scooters and roller blades are only allowed on the school bus if they are secured in a bag.
- 8. No bullying, harassment, aggressive behavior or discriminatory or abusive language toward the driver or others is permitted, on or off the bus.
- State law and/or district policy prohibits the following items on school buses: alcohol, drugs, tobacco, weapons or facsimile weapons, animals, insects, glass items, explosives, fireworks, and other dangerous or legally prohibited items.
- 10. Students can get off the bus only at their designated stops. Any changes require a parent/guardian's written request that has been approved by a school administrator and by Transportation.
- 11. Only assigned students and school staff are allowed to ride on a school bus, unless special permission is granted by Transportation or a school leader.
